San Francisco, CA, September 20, 2023—Southern Exposure is thrilled to invite you to the 2023 Monster Drawing Rally, the action-packed art-making event where you witness the Bay Area artist community at work, battle it out with other guests for the artworks of your dreams, and walk away with pieces from your favorite local artists. All artwork created sells for the low price of \$100, and as part of our commitment to supporting artists, all participating artists have the option to receive up to a 50% commission of the sale, with remaining proceeds going directly to furthering our work at Southern Exposure. Not to mention, artwork from past years will be available for purchase at even lower costs!



Fill your walls with art from the artists making the Bay Area the special home that it is to so many of us. This year the Monster Drawing Rally is in-person Saturday, October 21, 3-9 PM, at <u>The Lab</u>. The Monster Drawing Rally is an incredible afternoon of artmaking and fundraising where over 100 local artists create brand-new work right before your eyes. As you spy on the creative process, you'll see sketches, paintings, and collages morph into full-fledged artworks – immediately available. Enjoy a DJ, drinks available for purchase, and an art-making table for kids!

Everyone is welcome at the 2023 Monster Drawing Rally! Online early bird tickets are just \$20 through September 21, and \$25 after September 21—space is limited, so purchase yours today! Tickets will also be available at the door for \$30. Or <u>volunteer</u> and come to the event for free! By attending the Monster Drawing Rally, you're making it possible for us to continue to uplift the community through art.

Don't miss out on the Early Bird Special: The first 50 people to purchase tickets for our 2023 Monster Drawing Rally will receive a new, limited-edition print by acclaimed artist Cathy Lu, for free! Cathy Lu is an artist on Southern Exposure's current Curatorial Council and her work deconstructs assumptions held about Asian American identity and unpacks experiences of immigration, cultural hybridity, and cultural assimilation. She recently was awarded a SECA Award from SFMoMA. Ticket purchasers after the initial 50 will have the option to add-on a print for \$20.

This year's extended timeframe means that more artists can participate safely, spread across the larger time window so our space at The Lab never goes beyond a safe capacity for social distancing. It also means more time for attendees to enjoy the scene and scope out their favorite pieces or collect art gifts for the holiday season.

COVID protocols: Masking is strongly suggested; free masks will be provided.

Accessibility: The Lab is an ADA accessible venue. There are two gender-neutral bathroom areas with ADA accessible toilets. Main gallery is up one flight of stairs. Working elevator is operable at request. Seating will be provided. We will have two air purifiers operating in the space. A written description of the event is available.

Getting there: Located on 16th St, just off Mission St, The Lab is close to BART and many MUNI bus lines. As The Lab does not own any parking, no dedicated parking is available for this event.
