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

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Two new solo projects at Southern Exposure:

Beginning May 22 and continuing through June 27, 2015

May 8, 2015, San Francisco, CA – Southern Exposure is thrilled to announce two new research-based solo projects beginning May 22, 2015 by Bay Area artists Lauren Marie Taylor and Bernie Lubell. Each artist will be in residence at Southern Exposure for two weeks, transforming the gallery with installations, events and their ongoing research into current and historic technologies.

Lauren Marie Taylor presents *No Man's Land* from May 22 -- June 6, an exhibition looking to science-fiction and the history of heroic robots to explore the ways in which our machines reflect and embody our personal and national baggage. Between 1961 and 1965, the United States commemorated the Civil War Centennial. During this time Ray Bradbury, Philip K. Dick and Walt Disney each created an Abraham Lincoln robot. On the eve of an emergent technology and in the midst of a civil rights revolution, they sought to answer the questions, "What is a man?" and "What is a machine?". Fifty years later these questions remain as resonant as ever.

From June 13-27, artist Bernie Lubell installs his workshop and collaborates with visitors to create new work. Lubell creates wood mechanical metaphors for the human condition. Gears, pulleys, bellows, valves, levers, human force and sophisticated engineering power his interactive wooden machines. As an artist who has lived and worked in the Bay Area for 40 years, his influence is felt in the work of many local artists.

Collaborate with Bernie as he sets out to build an airship in the gallery at Southern Exposure. In two workshops and ongoing studio hours, visitors and Bernie will work together to create an air powered flying machine inspired by Frederick Marriott's 1869 airship Avitor, expanding on Bernie's ongoing research into breath and the force of air.
